

Dr. Damilola S. Olawuyi is the Executive Director of the Institute for Oil, Gas, Energy, Environment and Sustainable Development, Afe Babalola University, Nigeria. Dr. Olawuyi's areas of research cut across broad areas of public international law, specifically natural resources, energy and environment. He has published more than two dozen journal articles and three books in these areas of law, and has provided expert advice and opinion on seabed mining, electric power plant projects, carbon emission reduction, and credit trading projects (including carbon capture and sequestration, energy efficiency, and agricultural offset projects in emerging markets) with a focus on Africa. Dr. Olawuyi is the Vice President of the Nigerian Branch of the International Law Association; Editor-in Chief of the Nigerian Journal of Sustainable Development Law and Policy; an Associate Fellow of the Center for Sustainable Development Law, Montreal; and an Associate Fellow of the International Development Law Organization, Rome, Italy. He was most recently a University Research Fellow at the Consortium for Peace Studies, University of Calgary. He teaches international environmental law, oil and gas law, and international human rights law as a Senior Lecturer at Afe Babalola University, Nigeria. Dr. Olawuyi also provides legal advice and services as an energy lawyer at the leading global law firm, Norton Rose Fulbright, Canada LLP. Dr. Olawuyi holds a Ph.D. in Energy and Environmental Law from the University of Oxford, United Kingdom, an LL.M from Harvard University, and another LL.M from the University of Calgary, Canada. He earned his LL.B. from Igbinedion University, Nigeria, graduating in First Class Honours and his B.L. degree from the Nigerian Law School, also graduating in First Class Honours.
